

# SIMPLEVIEWER WEB GALLERY WITH ADOBE BRIDGE

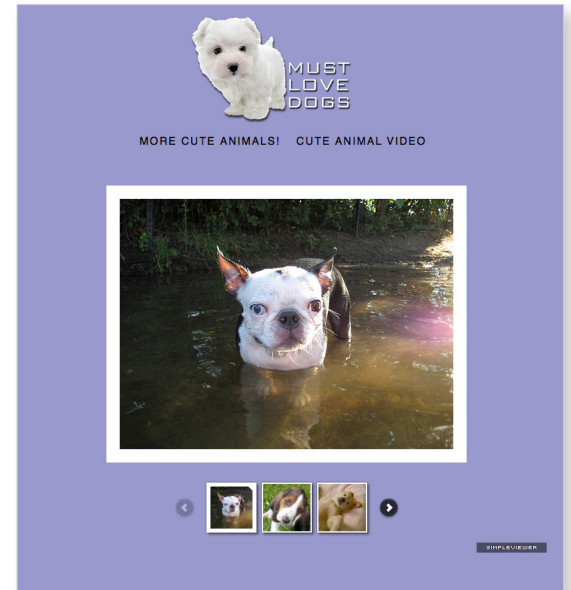

## 1. SimpleViewer is a little free software that you use to create galleries. There are two ways to use it:

- Download and install the software from <http://www.simpleviewer.net>.
- Use the version that is bundled with Adobe Bridge.

## 2. We're going to use it to create a web gallery of adorable dog photos:

- First, we'll prepare a web page in which to put the gallery (to save time, I have pre-created the page for you)
- Then, we'll create a gallery using Adobe Bridge/Simple Viewer
- Adobe Bridge does this by creating a web page with the gallery in it.
- We'll then learn how to put a web page inside a web page using the `<iframe>` tag.

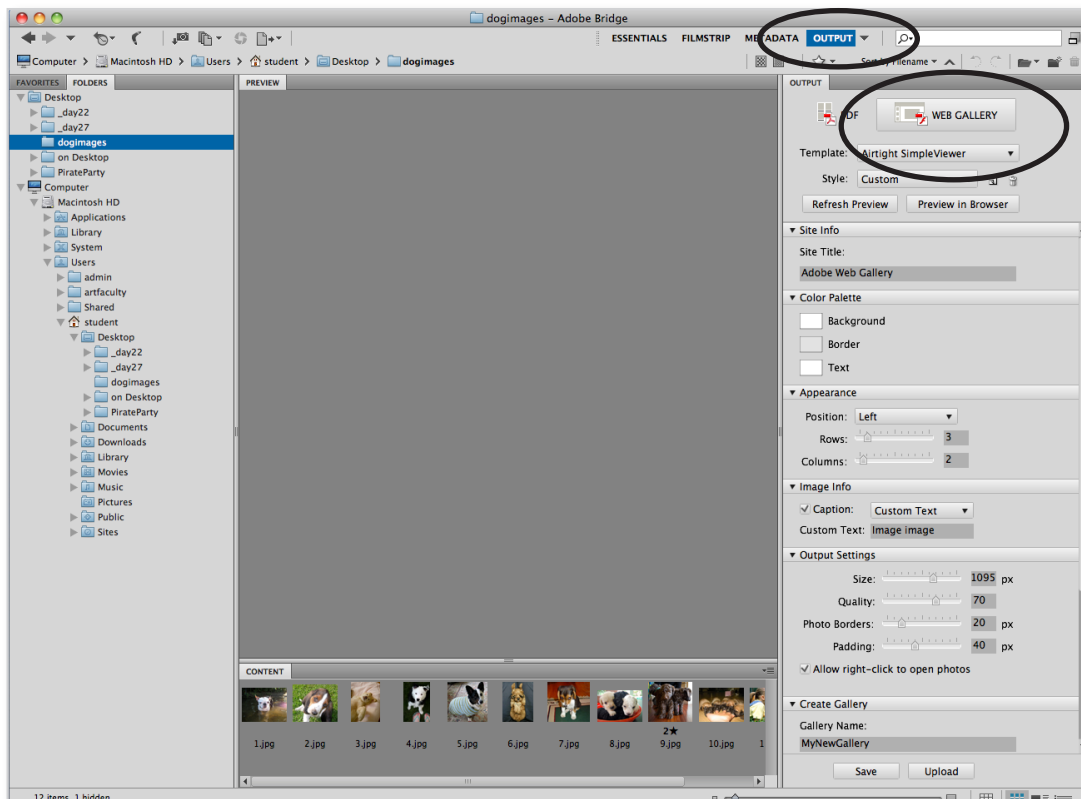


## 3. Prepare the web page.

- Open Dreamweaver and create a site.
  - » Create a root folder for the site and put it on the desktop
  - » Create an images folder for the site inside root folder.
- From the WebGalleryResources folder you downloaded,
  - » Open DogGalleryStart.html and styles.css.
  - » Save each as a file in the new site you just created.
- Attach style.css to the DogGalleryStart.html pages.
- Insert the Must Love Dogs image right inside `<div id="wrapper">`. The image is in with the others in the DogImages folder.

## 4. Create the web gallery

- Open Bridge
- Select **Output** from the view mode
- Select **Web Gallery**
- Select template **Airtight SimpleViewer**
- Select a Style
- In the left column, navigate to the dog photos folder. You'll know you have it when you see the dog photos in the **Content Area**



- Select all the photos in the **Content Area**
- Select **Preview in Browser**
- Adjust output (background color)
- Select **Preview in Browser**
- Create a **Gallery Name**
- Choose the **Desktop** for your Save Location.
- Hit Save. Bridge will create a folder on the desktop with the name you gave the gallery. It will contain the html gallery page and all the backup resources.
- **Move the folder inside the root folder for the site we created in Dreamweaver.**

## 5. Insert web gallery into the html page.

- Go back to DogGalleryStart.html in Dreamweaver
- Immediately after the unordered list navigation ( which ends with </ul>), insert this markup:

```
<iframe src="path/to/index.html" />
```



**<iframe>s insert another webpage  
inside a box "frame" in a webpage.**

**It works just like inserting an image -  
the src is the path to the webpage you  
want to insert.**

## 6. Make adjustments to the gallery and to the CSS until it pretty much matches the image of the Must Love Dogs web page.

## 7. Stay organized. Go slow. Know where your folders and files are.

- For example, if you don't like the first gallery you create, you can either adjust it or create a new one.
- When you create a new one, give it a new name so you don't overwrite the old one, unless you want to.
